

From waterfalls to sculptures, there's plenty to see in the Haliburton Highlands.

. RAGGED FALLS The falls, close to Algonquin Provincial Park, demonstrate the powerful, erosive force of glacial meltwater. A short trail leads to a lookout over the thundering whitewater. One of the top 10 waterfalls in Ontario! 1089 Ragged Falls Park Road, off Hwy 60

2. GROUP OF SEVEN & TOM THOMSON OUTDOOR EXHIBIT The exhibit showcases the connection between the Oxtongue Lake community and the illustrations of the Group of Seven and Tom Thomson. Read about the painters and their work that depicts the local landscape. **3971 Hwy 60**

3. DORSET SCENIC LOOKOUT TOWER Visitors are welcome to climb 142 metres (465 feet) above Lake of Bays and enjoy the view from the treetop lookout. There are ground-level viewing points too. 1191 Dorset Scenic Tower Road, Dorset

4. DORSET HERITAGE MUSEUM The museum tells the story of early pioneer life in the Dorset area, focusing on local settlers and traditional logging practices. 1040 Main Street, Dorset

5. ALGONQUIN HIGHLANDS TRAILS OFFICE Enjoy a relaxing canoe rental on the crystal-clear Lake St. Nora or take a self-guided interpretive hike on the Geomorphology Trail. Information about local outdoor adventure activities can be found right here. 20130 Hwy 35

6. HAWK LAKE LOG CHUTE is man-made trough, used to carry logs over the rough river landscape to a sawmill, is a truly Canadian icon. It's testament to the tenacity of the men who made their living in the logging industry, and whose ourage helped forge the communities of rural Ontario. **1584 Big Hawk Lake Road**



7. HALIBURTON - STANHOPE AIRPORT Stop by while touring the area and see the 762-metre runway that provides services to residents and visitors. Flying tours and fly-in events are scheduled throughout the year. 1168 Stanhope Airport Road

8. STANHOPE MUSEUM The Heritage Gardens here pay homage to the settlers of the late 1800s and early 1900s who adapted heir farming and gardening knowledge to this climate. The world's largest lumberjack is just waiting for a photo op! 1123 North Shore Road

9. BUTTERMILK FALLS

This beach on the shore of the Gull River is packed with amenities: a playground, public washrooms, poat launch, a small dock, and picnic tables. It's a great point to launch your lazy river float to downtown Minden. Rotary Park Road off Hwy 35, Minden

The water over these falls has some serious force behind it. At the top of the waterfalls a bridge leads

I. MINDEN HILLS CULTURAL CENTRE ncludes the Agnes Jamieson Gallery, Minden Hills Museum, and Nature's Place. Find year-round events, workshops and tours for the whole family about visual arts, nature and heritage. 12. PANORAMA PARK - LOOKOUT A must-see with its stunning views over the town of Minden and the hills beyond. It's a perfect stop at sunset and in fall, and offers a beautiful setting for a picnic, with trees providing natural shade. Panorama Park Road off of South Lake Road

13. MINDEN WHITEWATER PRESERVE View the spectacular beauty of some of Canada's best whitewater. Take the footpath along the rapids for

great vantage points to watch the many kayaking activities that take place. **1782 Horseshoe Lake Road**

14. RITCHIE FALLS There are several small falls in this little park. The largest is right under the one-lane road bridge, while at least two others are just downstream. If you cross the bridge and walk a little further, you'll meet the Haliburton Rail Trail. Ritchie Falls Road, Minden Hills

15. FURNACE FALLS The falls are visible from the bridge as you cross the Irondale River. The surrounding park is a great place or a break, and the falls, while small, are picturesque. **6924 County Road 503**

16. HALIBURTON FISH HATCHERY The Hatchery features displays about hunting and fishing heritage, fish populations, and the famous Haliburton Gold Lake Trout. The centre sits on a 10-hectare property with an archery range and extensive trail system. 6712 Gelert Road

17. HALIBURTON SCULPTURE FOREST & **HALIBURTON SCHOOL OF ART + DESIGN** A unique outdoor collection of sculptures by Canadian and international artists with trails for summer

biking and hiking and winter skiing and snowshoeing. **297 College Drive**

18. HALIBURTON HIGHLANDS MUSEUM The story of Haliburton awaits you. The main museum features a variety of exhibits, while Reid House, built in the 1880s, depicts everyday life more than 100 years ago. **66 Museum Road, Haliburton**

19. RAILS END GALLERY & HEAD LAKE PARK The gateway to craft and art from the Haliburton region. Knowledgeable staff and volunteers will ntroduce you to the rich and varied cultural landscape of the Ontario's Highlands. Located in the old train tation building. 23 York Street, Haliburton

20. SKYLINE PARK - LOOKOUT A quick detour off Highway 118, you'll find an impressive lookout over the village of Haliburton and surrounding area. Great for viewing the fall colours! **Skyline Park Road off Hwy 118, Haliburton**

21. WILBERFORCE RED CROSS OUTPOST MUSEUM
Considered the best-preserved Red Cross Outpost huilding in Canada by the National Historic Sites and Considered the best-preserved Red Cross Outpost building in Canada by the National Historic Sites and

Monuments Board, the museum displays many original artifacts. 2314 Loop Road, Wilberforce 22. HIGH FALLS

Part of Algonquin Park, this all-season trail has a good swimming hole in summer, exciting high water in spring and easy exploring when the water is low in fall. Winter can have beautiful ice formations.

23. KIDD SCHOOLHOUSE MUSEUM This little heritage museum is in the original log schoolhouse built by Walter Kidd in 1890 to serve the tiny mmunity of Kidds Corners. It's the oldest surviving schoolhouse in Cardiff Township. 5375 Loop Road, Highland Grove

24. CARDIFF DRAGONFLY This giant insect was erected in 1998 as a tribute to the hamlet of Cardiff and is now a symbol of the village. Constructed from recycled plastic, copper roofing material and an old water tank for the head, this

huge dragonfly is one of a kind. 2778 Monck Road, Cardiff **25. GOODERHAM SUN VILLAGE**

his John Leonard sculpture is made of genuine historic artifacts: a saw used until it was made part of the culpture, and a water turbine more than 100 years old and used in the original sawmill. 1043 Community Centre Road, Gooderham
